WE ARE OPENING FOR MASS

We have reached the next step along the path to normality, which means that we can now hold daily Mass with a congregation present.

You MUST wear a mask/face covering to cover nose and mouth

covering, to cover nose and mouth.

Whilst this is a much longed-for development, it comes with its own rules and regulations. However, provided we can deal with and indeed adhere to the instructions given to us by our Archbishop, all of which follow government guidelines, we expect things to go well.

Following an extensive and stringent risk assessment and much preparation in order to make the

Church "Covid compliant", we

begin today with three Masses.

Please note that for the time being,

there will be no 10am Sunday Mass.

The Saturday evening First Mass of Sunday will recommence next Saturday 18th July. Meanwhile, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is suspended. Starting in the coming week, the 10am daily Mass returns from Monday to Saturday. This means that we shall now cease to open for private prayer. Each day, Father Deo and Father Tomasz will say at least one other Mass, though this will be without a congregation.

We still need more volunteer stewards, aged 18 or over, not self-isolating, nor in any at-risk category. Please contact the Parish Office to register your availability.

If we do not get sufficient volunteers, we shall be obliged to cancel Masses at short notice.

In due course, we expect to bring back Confessions, funerals, weddings and Baptisms. We cannot use our Reconciliation Room, and are working on an alternative. We ask for your patience whilst the necessary planning takes place. Indeed, not all parishes will be in a position to restart everything, nor are they obliged to do so. The hall remains out of action. Please continue to follow all instructions and directions given to you by the clergy and stewards. If we should fail to adhere to the instructions given, this could threaten our ability to continue with Masses, which in turn could affect the Church in her entirety. We must all be good stewards! There will be no singing, no sign of peace, and no bidding prayers. Sermons will be somewhat shorter! Please continue to follow all NHS and Public Health guidelines.

Standing orders assure us of just £750.00 per week. Some recent new Standing Orders have not been applied by banks. Please check your bank statements, and contact the Parish Office for advice and forms to get things moving if you were affected. Please consider joining the Gift Aid Scheme. We are currently considering how best to distribute the latest Gift Aid envelopes to parishioners, and will most likely arrange for these to be hand delivered as soon as possible. We cannot put them in a room to be picked up on an individual basis. We appeal to all parishioners to consider setting up Standing Orders, whether or not they qualify for the Gift Aid Scheme. They make a significant difference, and provide a greater degree of certainty of income, thus aiding effective budgeting.
