PUBLIC MASSES

We now hold public Masses daily, subject to COVID regulations, and instructions from Archbishop John, following government guidelines. Meanwhile, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended. Daily public Mass is at 10am from Monday to Saturday, with at least one private Mass from Monday to Friday with no congregation. We are not open for private prayer. We need more volunteer stewards, aged 18 or over, without whom we may have to cancel Masses. Please wait for information on Baptism, Weddings and Funerals. The hall remains out of action. Please continue to follow all instructions and directions given to you by the clergy and stewards. There will be no singing, no sign of peace, and no bidding prayers. Sermons will be somewhat shorter! Please continue to follow all NHS and Public Health guidelines.

THE REPOSITORY

New stock has just arrived.
The Repository will open when there is somebody available to staff it.
In order to comply with COVID guidelines, a maximum of two persons may enter at any one time.
Please refrain from touching items, and allow the person on duty to show you any items. Please wear a mask and use the hand sanitiser provided.

HOLY COMMUNION

Please approach as directed by stewards. Kindly lower your mask; there is no need to remove it in order to consume the Host.

Please remove any gloves. Wait for the Host to be carefully dropped into your open hands. Then replace your mask and kindly exit the Church, unless remaining for Confession.

CONFESSION

On Saturdays after the 10am Mass, from 10.30am until 11am in the working sacristy, where the servers normally vest, via the main Sacristy. You will firstly be directed to the Retro Chapel to wait. After your Confession, you should leave immediately and make your penance at home. Please follow all social distancing guidelines and any directions given.

READINGS FOR MASS THIS SUNDAY

First Reading – (Apocalypse 11:19; 12:1-6, 10)

The sanctuary of God in heaven opened, and the ark of the covenant could be seen inside it.

Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Then a second sign appeared in the sky, a huge red dragon which had seven heads and ten horns, and each of the seven heads crowned with a coronet. Its tail dragged a third of the stars from the sky and dropped them to the earth, and the dragon stopped in front of the woman as she was having the child, so that he could eat it as soon as it was born from its mother. The woman brought a male child into the world, the son who was to rule all the nations with an iron sceptre, and the child was taken straight up to God and to his throne, while the woman escaped into the desert, where God had made a place of safety ready. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women, you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy.

Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'
