Friday with no congregation. We are not open for private prayer. We need more volunteer stewards, aged 18 or over, without whom we

may have to cancel Masses. Please wait for information on Baptism, Weddings and Funerals. The hall remains out of action.

Please continue to follow all instructions and directions given to you by the clergy and stewards. There will be no singing, no sign of peace, and no bidding prayers. Sermons will be somewhat shorter! Please continue to follow all NHS and Public Health guidelines.

MASS INTENTIONS There are plenty of opportunities to have Masses said. Please contact the Parish Office to make a booking and for advice on Mass offerings.

THE REPOSITORY New stock has just arrived. The Repository will open when there is somebody available to staff it. In order to comply with COVID guidelines, a maximum of two persons may enter at any one time. Please refrain from touching items, and allow the person on duty to show you any items. Please wear a mask and use the hand sanitiser provided.
