Next, he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready.

Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized the servants, maltreated them and killed them.

The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town.
