RECENT LOCKDOWN

Following a report from a parishioner testing positive for COVID, we shut down for a few days. Another parishioner most generously paid for us to have a deep clean of the church, enabling us to open again sooner than planned. Please note that it was the Track and Trace cards which you fill in when you attend Mass that enabled all those affected to be contacted quickly. If you get symptoms, and you have attended Mass anywhere, please mention the church, so that contact may be made as quickly as possible.

COVID RESTRICTIONS

As we continue to hold public Masses. We still need more stewards.

To become a steward, you should be over 18, and free from COVID symptoms, either actual or suspected. Stewards also clean the church between Masses.

Please do not come to the church if you have been told to shield; If you have any symptoms, whether COVID or not, please stay away, to avoid the risk of spreading the virus. Please respect the

stewards and kindly do as they direct you.

Please use a new, previously unused disposable face mask or other face covering, or one which has been cleaned where it is washable. and ensure that it covers your nose and your mouth. You must have evidence of a valid exemption. Hand sanitiser is available at the church. Even if you have sanitised your hands before entering, you may still be asked to

use our own hand sanitiser.

Always keep at least 2 metres from others. Please follow instructions regarding the reception of Holy Communion or a blessing, and

When you leave the church, please do not gather outside to socialise and chat, and do not mix with anybody outside of your household or appointed "bubble".
