READINGS & PRAYERS FOR THIS SUNDAY

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

(cf Isaiah 48:20) Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

FIRST READING

(Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48)

As Peter reached the house, Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said, 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise,' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said,

'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we

have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ.

Afterwards, they begged him to stay on for some days.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 97:1-4, response cf v 2)

R: The Lord has shown his salvation to the nations.

SECOND READING (1 John 4:7-10)

God's love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only Son so that we could have life through him; this is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us when he sent his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away.

I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you.

I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father.
